All students and tutors who receive or provide services based on the **ProLiteracy/Dollar General Student Referral Project** are eligible for consideration. Awards are sponsored by the Dollar General Literacy Foundation.

The award recipients will be announced at the COABE/ProLiteracy Joint Conference in March in Chicago. Award recipients will receive a \$1000 travel stipend for the winners and \$1500 for the nominating organization. Individual winners will also each receive a trophy in honor of his/her accomplishments and free registration to the Conference.

Council News

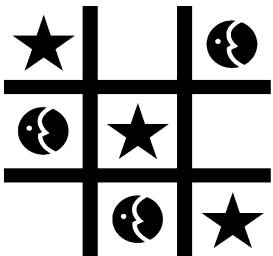

The Activity Corner



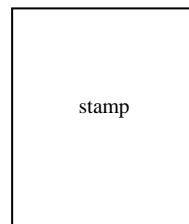
